OUTFITTER CLIENT deer hunt CONTRACT rev. 0108

To all Hunters:

Thank you for booking your hunt with us. *Be sure you check with your airline to assure you have required I.D. to board an international flight. Also the airlines charge for over two checked and two carry on's. Use a huge duffel bag and put everything you can in it to cut down on baggage. I've put my cameras, tackle boxes, arrow tube etc. in mine before. As of January 1st 2006 a passport will be required for international travel.*

Also if there is any way you can, avoid Sunday flights. Fly in on a Friday or Saturday and get a motel and relax. Do the same on your return. Get a motel for Sunday night and return on Monday. The Saskatoon airport is small and they do not handle busy days well.

Our job is to provide you with the best hunting experience we possibly can. If there are any complaints about our service or guides please let me know, in writing if possible for my records, and do the same if you have an outstanding experience.

Your hunt is for a trophy animal. Please do not shoot young animals.

The standard I would like my hunters to aim for is not shooting a whitetail buck 4x4 or 4x5 under 130" gross Boone and Crockett. On 5x5's or better the standard is 145. There is a \$500.00 trophy fee on 5x5's or better smaller than 145". (I give a 5" grace and double that for first time Saskatchewan hunters)

If you hit a buck and lose it you can continue hunting for \$1000.00. Two strikes your out.

Included in your hunt:

*Clean comfortable lodging

*Clean bedding at the beginning of each hunt. **We want a clean room at the end of your hunt. There is no maid so I want hunters to put clean sheets on, sweep out room and bag the trash. Trash and dirty sheets set out in hallway for us to take care of.**

*Quality meals

*Transportation to and from the hunting site once daily

* Six nights lodging and 5 1/2 days hunting (Sunday after 2PM to Saturday afternoon)

We will retrieve and field dress all animals. I feel that a client should tip for trophy preparation. If you cannot afford to tip you should cape your own deer and help with the cleaning, skinning etc.

The recommended tip should be 10%-15% of your hunt price based on satisfaction. Split amongst guides, myself and cook with consideration for trophy care. If I am guiding, tip me like a guide and if you take a great buck I expect you to be more generous with me since I am the one that builds and sets up all blinds. I work extremely hard and spend enormous amounts of money to provide a safe comfortable and productive hunt and like to feel that it's appreciated.

All Hunters should bring:

*License and tax check or cash. License and taxes are not included in the hunt price. Around \$500.00

* Any alcohol or sodas they may want for the week

*Any specific candies or snacks they may want.

*Very warm clothing and plenty of spare socks as well as warm, waterproof boots and several pair of warm gloves.

* Quality thermos. Soup thermos especially

***A soft case for transport of weapon to and from the hunting area. (Required by hunting regulations)**

* Good binoculars

*Backpacks and/or fanny packs for taking gear to and from hunting blinds (for deer hunters a sizeable duffle bag is recommended)

* Video cameras

*sharp knife

* Good flashlights and extra batteries

* Your personal toiletries

*Ice chest for transport of meat if you are driving up. (I have an excellent taxidermist I can take your deer to and we can distribute the meat to locals so this item can be eliminated.) **If you are only taking home cape and antlers I will freeze cape for your return trip. You can stop at the Canadian tire on your way out and pick up a tub to put cape and antlers in. If I have a tub that fits they are \$10.00**

*Deer hunters should bring small propane bottles for furnished heaters to heat blinds. Lots of chemical hand warmers and foot warmers are preferable to running heaters but using a heater beats freezing! We will have propane and chemical warmers for sale at camp in case hunters are unprepared or run out

*A jacket and hat that are solid blaze orange, white, red or yellow and a cap that is either blaze orange, red or yellow.

* We are on cell phone only. The only option for hunters is a **Sasktel mobility pre-paid card**. These can be purchased at 7/11 in Prince Albert on your way up or I will try to have some for sale at camp. **NO OTHER TYPE PHONE CARD WILL WORK If you call your cell provider and make arrangements you may be able to use your own cell phone at camp. Check there coverage. Sprint phones work**

All hunters will be required to sign a liability release prior to beginning their hunt.

The balance of your hunt is due within 60 days of your arrival date.

Please sign enclosed documents including liability release and return with your deposit.

Your Travel arrangements can be completely taken care of by Nanette Pikovsky at Travel Advisors International. She has done a great job for all my clients in the past. Phone 952-474-3666 Fax 952-474-3637. Be sure you tell her you are hunting with me. She can take care of everything but if you need rent car only call Kelly Erickson with discount leasing in Saskatoon and tell him you are hunting with Andy Milam and have been promised special rates. His number is 306-242-6556. He can fix you up in Saskatoon or Prince Albert depending on your final destination. He can have someone pick you up at the airport and take you back to the airport when you return.

Also for comparison try Travel Canada and ask for Jim. They can also make all arrangements and will greet you at the airport and take you to your hotel or rental car. 1-877-608-3500

If you are bringing a firearm or firearms on your hunt you will need to register them. If you are flying I strongly advise that you pre-register as customs at the airport will be very busy. If you are driving and know where you will be crossing, call ahead of time and ask if they are set up for pre registration. If not it is no big deal. Still it would help to fill out the paperwork (application) ahead of time. Do not sign application until you are in the presence of customs. If you have Internet access go to www.cfc-ccaf.gc.ca <<http://www.cfc-ccaf.gc.ca>> , in left column click Visitors to Canada. Then click notice to outfitters. Then at the bottom of that page click on firearms declaration forms. Then download 909E/F. It is really a simple process but if you are flying in pre-registration will save you a lot of time.

They will also want your phone number, flight number and date and time of arrival. You can mail your application to: Canada Customs and Revenue Agency, 2130 Airport Drive, Saskatoon, SK, Canada S7L6M6 of you can fax to 306-975-5917. Try to allow at least 10 days. A third option if you do not have a fax or the ten days needed call 306-975-4755 and you can fill out the application over the phone. If you need any help, or have any other questions.

This pre-registration information is for initial point of entry in Saskatoon. If you enter Canada anywhere other than Saskatoon please contact customs at your point of entry.

Each hunter will have first opportunity to re-book his or her dates. To hold these dates a deposit will be required at the end of their hunt.

Deposits are non refundable. If you have to cancel you will be responsible for selling your spot to get your money back. I will help sell it if I can.

We are looking forward to your hunt and hope to provide the best hunting experience ever!

Camp Rules/ Procedures

- Legal shooting is from ½ hour before sunrise to ½ hour after sunset. Your guide will inform you of the exact times- DO NOT VARY FROM THESE TIMES
- You may only shoot one deer.
- You may only shoot the animal you are hunting. No fur bearing animals are legal.
- Your hunt is over if you draw blood so pick your shots carefully.
- While you are hunting you are expected to stay in your stand at all times except for using the restroom.
- When a deer is shot, only leave the stand to look at the deer and flag trail. Then get back in the stand or wait at the drop-off point.
- If you have to take a dump go away from the stand towards the drop-off point at least 300 yards and bury all sign.
- Do not field dress your deer at the kill site.
- After you shoot radio for your guide. It is not always possible to reach us so be prepared to stay all day.
- Please always use a bottle to urinate and discard at or past the drop-off point.

- No littering allowed. Bring in all debris at the end of your hunt. If there is debris in your blind notify your guide so that he can clean it up.
- Please do not smoke in the blinds. Bring nicotine patches or gum to help you make it through the day.
- Always respect our stands, your guides and the hunter that will follow you.
- Your guides and the camp cook work for your tips. Appropriate gratuities are expected.

Waiver of Liability

THE UNDERSIGNED DOES HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE THAT: I was informed, prior to contracting with South Bay Outfitters (hereinafter referred to as “the Outfitter”), that I would be required as a condition of my contract with the Outfitter to sign this waiver of liability, and a copy of this waiver was supplied to me at that time.

THE UNDERSIGNED DOES HEREBY FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGE THAT: I have had sufficient opportunity prior to contracting with the Outfitter to consider whether I wished to sign this waiver, and having considered, and fully understanding the terms of this waiver, I now sign this waiver of my own free will and intending to be legally bound hereby.

THEREFORE, as partial consideration for the Outfitter agreeing to contract with me for the provision of outfitting services, I DO HEREBY for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, forever waive and release, and agree to hold harmless the Outfitter from and against, any and all liability for any personal injury or property damage which I have suffered or may suffer, either now or at any time in the future, and arising from any cause or thing whatsoever, whether within the control of the Outfitter or otherwise and whether resulting from any act or omission of the Outfitter or the Outfitter’s servants, suppliers, agents, guests or otherwise and whether arising from negligence or gross negligence on the part of any person and whether arising in the course of the performance of my contract with the Outfitter or in the course of some activity collateral to or unrelated to the performance of the said contract. Further, I hereby covenant and agree to indemnify the Outfitter for any and all liability which the Outfitter may be or become subject, to myself or to any person claiming through or under myself, arising out of or in the course of the performance of the contract between myself and the outfitter.

WITHOUT LIMITING the generality of the foregoing, I HEREBY covenant and agree that I shall not pursue legal action against the Outfitter for any personal injury or property damage suffered by me and arising out of any of the following activities or things:

1. Boarding or alighting from any aircraft, boat or other vehicle or form of transportation, or entering or exiting from tree stands;
2. Use of camp facilities, lodgings and equipment;
3. Reaction, allergic or otherwise, from consumption of food;
4. Delays in obtaining any required medical attention;
5. Activity and behavior of game or any wild animal, whether wounded or otherwise;

6. From drowning;
7. From the use of weapons or fishing gear, by myself or by any other person;
8. From theft or loss of belongings;
9. From non-compliance with licensing requirements;
10. From failure or collapse of tree stands or other installations owned by the Outfitter;
11. From the activities of servants, agents, or other guests of the Outfitter, whether such activities are within the control of the Outfitter or otherwise.
12. From traveling into or out of the woods or other hunting area and from transporting materials, equipment or game either into or out of such areas.

Re- Booking Policy

Please read carefully

I will not call hunters for deposits. My goal is to have enough bookings that some hunters may only be able to get their spots every other year.

If you are a repeat hunter, please have your deposit money in camp to book for the following year **before you leave**. If you have not put money down before you leave the hunter in camp the next week could book your spot.

All dates that do not have a deposit attached are for sale. That means that at the end of your hunt you could find that your dates for the following year may already be sold and you would have to book a year in advance.

If you want to book a year in advance to prevent that, ½ deposit would be required with the other ½ deposit due January 1st of the year of the hunt.

Directions to camp

Head North out of Saskatoon to Prince Albert on Hwy. 11. The airport is on the North side of town so this is easy just follow signs.

Just outside of Prince Albert you will T into Hwy 2. This will take you through Prince Albert and north towards our place.

If you want supplies look for McDonalds on your left. There is a Canadian Tire beside it, which is like a Walmart.

For Liquor or beer proceed past McDonalds less that a mile you will see a Safeway. The large brown building in the front of the parking lot is the beer and liquor store.

Proceed north on Hwy 2. We are approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes north of P.A.

When you reach the main entrance to Prince Albert National Park the mile markers start at 0. Between mile marker 40 and 50 you will see an old store on the right at the junction of the Elaine Lake road (916). South Bay Outfitters area begins here on the west side of the road.

Right past K50, on the right you will see a vacation route map/ point of interest sign. 4 miles or 6 Km past take left on Wanner Lake Rd. (unpaved).

There should be a South Bay Outfitter sign at this turn. Go 1.2 miles and turn left. Should be another sign at this point. Our lodge is now approximately 2 miles on the right. You will see our gate with a sign on it.
